What Is EContra One-Step®?

EContra One-Step is a morning-after pill—sometimes referred to as an emergency contraceptive pill—to reduce your chance of getting pregnant. It is a backup method of preventing pregnancy that will not interfere with your regular birth control.^{2,3}

How EContra One-Step Works²

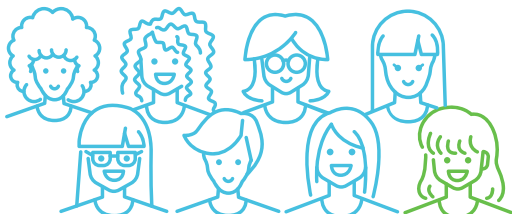


EContra One-Step helps prevent pregnancy when taken within 72 hours (3 days) of unprotected sex or a known birth control failure

EContra One-Step is a single pill that contains the same active ingredient as in many regular birth control pills, but in a single, higher dose



It works mainly by **stopping the release of an egg** from the ovary. It may also prevent fertilization of a released egg, or attachment of a fertilized egg to the uterus.



When used correctly, EContra One-Step can significantly decrease the chance that you will get pregnant. About **7 out of every 8 women** who would have gotten pregnant will not become pregnant.
